

George Cavros **Nevada Clean Energy Manager | Senior Attorney**



George Cavros is the Nevada clean energy manager at Western Resource Advocates (WRA). He represents the organization in proceedings before the Public Utility Commission of Nevada and works with utilities, regulators, and energy coalition partners to advocate for changes that will help decarbonize the energy, transportation, and building sectors throughout the state.

Cavros joined WRA in 2023, but he's no stranger to environmental efforts. He has always envisioned a future where coming generations would have clean air and water, healthy rivers and beautiful public lands. Knowing that we have a small window to address the impact of carbon pollution, he is proud to have joined WRA, the only organization in the West operating at the local, state, and federal level.

Early in his career, a new fossil fuel plant was proposed in his community, and Cavros knew he had to do more. He launched and led a campaign that derailed the new plant. And his efforts made such an impact that he later helped another community do the same. These pivotal experiences led Cavros to pursue his education and a career in law so that he could continue to advocate effectively for the causes for which he cares deeply.

His public involvement didn't end there. Cavros helped launch a statewide ballot initiative in 2015 that preserved solar choice for customers in Florida, which still stands today. He has worked in clean energy for more than two decades, having represented a regional clean energy non-profit in the Southeast, where he advocated for outcomes that paved the way to a cleaner, lower cost energy future for Florida families.

Beyond advocacy efforts, Cavros ran a private law practice that focused on protecting the natural environment and enacting clean energy policies. And he enjoyed his role as an adjunct professor of Environmental Policy, and Energy Law.

Cavros has long loved the West's unique and diverse landscapes, where recreational opportunities abound, and communities thrive. Today, he resides in Nevada with his wife, son, and their cat, Zeus. He enjoys hiking, playing guitar, and taking his son birding.

He holds a Bachelor of Science in Accounting from the University of Maryland, as well as a Juris Doctorate from Nova Southeastern University, Shepard Broad Law Center.
